Board Notes

Several issues were addressed at the September board meeting. Claire Landrum reported on the Door-Side Service program.

The board discussed the possibility of allowing limited browsing by appointment, in addition to Door-Side Service. Only two patrons at a time would be able to browse for 10 minutes. Appointments would take place from 2 to 4 pm on Mondays and Wednesdays. Patrons would be asked to use sanitizer before browsing. Because donated books are being quarantined in the Children's Room, children wouldn't be able to browse, though their parents would. The Book Sale Room would be open, and Desk Volunteers would wear gloves when handling money. Claire will ask the Desk Volunteers if they are interested in providing such a service.

The appeal letter was discussed. The text has been written, and Nancy McCarthy is taking pictures for the cover. The goal is to mail out the appeal letter the week of November 16. Because of COVID, we can't do our usual envelope stuffing party. Karen French will develop a plan for getting the mailing prepared safely.

The next NW Author Speaker Series event is scheduled for October 10, via Zoom. Apricot Irving will discuss her award-winning book, *The Gospel of Trees*. Karl Marlantes will speak on November 28; Jennifer Greer will do a presentation on January 23. Phyllis reported that there will be a Third Annual Writers Read Celebration; the theme will deal with the pandemic. Selected authors will read their work February 20 via Zoom. J.A. Janice will give a virtual talk on April 10. Plans are being made for speakers in March and May.

Phyllis reported that Jason Kunde and Les Sinclair have agreed to serve on the Endowment Investment Committee. Jason is the USBank branch manager. Les has been an active volunteer at book sales and other Library events.



The book that will be discussed on Wednesday, October 21, will be *Drawdown: The Most Comprehensive Plan Ever Proposed to Reverse Global Warming*, edited by Paul Hawken.


Drawdown presents the best thinking of an international coalition of researchers, professionals and scientists seeking to address the problem of climate change. One hundred techniques and practices are described in this guidebook for decreasing the world's carbon footprint.

Hawken has put together a book that has been described as a "magnificent achievement," "a rigorous and profound important resource," and a "beautiful, inspiring and deeply satisfying read."

Hawken is an environmentalist, journalist, author and entrepreneur. He has started and run ecological businesses, written about the impact of commerce on living systems, and consulted with governments and corporations on economic development, industrial ecology and environmental policy.

Mary Lloyd will lead the discussion, which will take place, via Zoom, on Wednesday, October 21, beginning at 7 p.m.


