#### **Board Notes**

Several issues were discussed during the July board meeting. Office Manager Jen Dixon reported that circulation numbers are good and approaching pre-pandemic levels. She also reported that Steve Lamontagne of Steve's Maintenance cleaned the windows at no charge and is planning to clean the gutters. Board members expressed their appreciation for his generosity and support.

The board discussed a draft annual report. There was a lively discussion about the need for and uses of the report and the type of information to include.

After many years, Janet Bates has decided to step back from overseeing the Children's Room. Board members expressed their gratitude for Janet's hard work and dedication. The board decided to form a Children's Library Committee to address the tasks involved in managing the Children's Room and children's programming, including acquisitions, accessioning, weeding, programming, etc.

Board members reviewed the policy of buy-3-getone-free and decided to suspend that policy during book sales like the July Fourth Sale, but to otherwise keep the policy in place until winter. At that time the policy will be revisited.

At one time library card fees were \$5 a year and library membership dues were \$10 a year. A few years ago library card fees were raised to \$10, but membership dues remained unchanged at \$10. Charging \$10 for both card fees and membership dues has caused continual confusion. The board decided to propose an increase in membership dues to \$15 at the September Membership Meeting.

Plans for the Fall Celebration on September 30 were discussed, as were the new gardening contract and the watering schedule for the pots in the front and back of the building.





# **Cannon Beach Reads August 16**

Fans of Brian Doyle can discuss his work by joining this month's meeting of the Cannon Beach Reads book club. The group will meet at 7 p.m., Wednesday, August 16, to discuss Doyle's "The Plover." This will be a hybrid meeting; participants can come to the library or Zoom in to the discussion.



Doyle tells the story of Irishman Declan O Donnell, who sets out to sea in his boat, the Plover, to get away from other people and their problems, but instead takes on an assortment of odd, entertaining and often needy passengers who join him in a series of adventures.

Reviewers have called "The Plover" a "rare and unusual book and a brilliant, mystical exploration of the human spirit" and a "joyous voyage of discovery."

Brian Doyle, who died in 2017 at the age of 60, was an award-winning writer, having received the Academy of Arts and Letters Award in Literature and three Pushcart Prizes. He was a long-time editor of Portland Magazine and a book reviewer for the Oregonian.

Doyle's poetry and essays were published in many national and international magazines, journals and newspapers. His other books include "Mink River," "Martin Marten" and "Chicago" all of which Cannon Beach Reads has discussed in previous years.

As the board looked at how to move forward, they decided on a new approach. It was decided the children's library should now be managed like the adult library. We are currently developing a small committee of three to five individuals, who will each take on various roles in the children' area.

Interested individuals should plan on committing a minimum of six to eight hours a month. We're seeking a diverse group of individuals with different backgrounds. Experience in children's libraries, schools, child development, and children's programming is a plus. Ideal applicants will have knowledge in at least one of the following areas: emergent readers, chapter books, junior fiction, manga, or young adult literature. Interested individuals should contact the library via email or phone, and fill out a volunteer application. Anyone interested is encouraged to apply.
