World of Haystack Rock Library Lecture Series

Keith Chandler has been at the Seaside Aquarium for over 40 years. His discussion will focus on changes that are occurring in our marine environment as they are reflected in the marine mammals of the Northwest. He will overview the marine mammals commonly seen close to our coastline and recent changes in the presence of various species.



In 1992 the Seaside Aquarium partnered with Portland State University and is now co-coordinators of the Southern Washington Northern Oregon Marine Mammal Stranding Network. The aquarium responds to both dead and live marine mammals on the beaches from Oysterville, Washington down to Tillamook Bay, Oregon.

Northwest Authors Series Saturday March 14, 2 p.m.

March is Women's History Month and the Northwest Authors Speaker Series is celebrating women's history by hosting Marianne Monson who will discuss and read from her new novel, *Her Quiet Revolution: A Novel of Martha Hughes Cannon, Frontier Doctor and First Female State Senator*.



After being the only woman to graduate from the Michigan Medical School in the early 1880's, Cannon practiced medicine in Utah, where she was active in politics and women's suffrage. She successfully ran against her husband for a seat in the state legislature, becoming the first woman state senator.

Cannon's story is especially relevant in 2020 which marks the 100th anniversary of Women's Suffrage in the US. The fight for women's suffrage was hard fought, beginning in 1848 and continuing until the US Secretary of State certified the 19th Amendment on August 26, 1920, giving women the vote throughout the US. Individual states had granted suffrage earlier: Wyoming was the first in 1869; Utah followed in 1870; Oregon didn't approve suffrage till 1912.

Monson is the author of other works dealing with women's history, including *Frontier Grit: The Unlikely Stories of Daring Pioneer Women*, and *Women of the Blue and Gray: True Stories of Mothers, Medics, Soldiers, and Spies of the Civil War*. Monson, who lives in Astoria, teaches at Clatsop Community College.

CB Reads March 18 at 7 p.m.

The book that will be discussed at the Cannon Beach Reads meeting on Wednesday evening, March 18, will be *Martin Marten*, by Brian Doyle.

Published in 2015, *Martin Marten* is a coming of age novel about both a pine marten named Martin and a 14-year-old boy named Dave, both of whom live in the woods on Mount Hood.

The novel received the Oregon Book Award for Young Adult Fiction in 2016, and the John Burroughs Medal for Distinguished Nature Writing in 2017, perhaps because it is, as one critic described it, "good for the soul" and full of happiness and love.

Brian Doyle was an award winning Oregon writer who called himself a "story catcher," and who wrote about spirituality, family and nature in more than two dozen books. Doyle in explaining his writing style, which often included long, comma-free sentences, said he loved runs of adjectives "like bursts of salmon in a river."

Bob Lundy will be leading the discussion on Wednesday, March 18, at the Library.

Cannon Beach Reads meets on the third Wednesday of each month at 7 p.m. New members are always welcome. Come enjoy the discussion and have some coffee and delicious treats.
